

The Midland Border Terrier Club Judges List Criteria.

A1 List.

This list indicates persons who have previously been approved by The Kennel Club to award Challenge Certificates in the breed, have carried out the appointment and have the support of the Midland Border Terrier Club.

A2 List

This list indicates persons who fulfil all the requirements for the A3 list and who have been assessed in accordance with Kennel Club requirements and accepted by the Kennel Club for inclusion on an A2 list and have the support of the Midland Border Terrier Club.

A3 List

Indicates persons who the Club would support to award Challenge Certificates in the Breed, but, who as yet, have not been approved by the Kennel Club for inclusion on the A2 List.
Criteria to be considered for inclusion on this A3 list:

Breed Specialist Judges

- To have the support of the Club and have:
- Been active in Border Terriers for a minimum of ten years
- A minimum of seven years experience of judging the breed (K.C. policy.)
- Judged at least one Breed Club Show and/or two Breed Club Supported Entry Shows at each of which at least forty Border Terriers were entered and present (KC policy.)
- Judged at least two hundred and fifty Border Terriers in breed classes over an adequate geographic spread. (K.C. policy.)
- Attended at least two Border Terrier Breed Specific seminars run in accordance with the relevant Kennel Club Code of Best Practice, and passed an examination and/or assessment where applicable. (KC Policy 01/07/2001.)
- Submitted an application/questionnaire if requested to do so. (K.C. policy 01/07/01)
- Undertaken to write show critiques as customarily requested by the weekly dog press.
- Been an owner or breeder of at least three Border Terriers when these dogs obtained their first entry in the Kennel Club Stud Book. (Save in exceptional circumstances.)
- To have stewarded at 12 Shows.

Non Breed Specialist Judges

To have the support of the Club and have:

- A minimum of five years' experience of judging the Breed (K.C. policy.)
- Judged at least one Breed Club Show and / or two Breed Club Supported Entry Shows at each of which at least forty Border terriers were entered and present
- Judged at least 200 Border Terriers in breed classes over an adequate geographic spread.
- Attended at least one Border Terrier breed specific seminar run in accordance with the relevant Kennel Club Code of Best Practice and passed an examination/or assessment where applicable. (KC Policy as of 01/07/2001.)
- Passed a Border Terrier breed examination or assessment if applicable
- Submitted an application/questionnaire if requested to do so
- Undertaken to write show critiques as customarily requested by the weekly dog press.
- To have bred and/ owned a minimum of 3 dogs of any breed when these dogs obtained their first entry in the Kennel Club Stud Book. (Save in exceptional circumstances.)
- Been approved to award C.C.'s to at least one other breed and have done so on at least three occasions. (K.C. policy.)

B List.

Indicates persons whom the Club would support to judge the breed at Open Shows or at Ch. Shows without C.C's.

Breed Specialist Judges:

To have the support of the Club and have:

- Been active in Border Terriers for a minimum of five years
- A minimum of two years judging experience
- Judged at least thirty Border Terriers in Breed classes
- Attended at least one Seminar on the Border Terrier Breed Standard
- Stewarded on at least two occasions at Open or Championship level
- Submitted an application / questionnaire if requested to do so
- **To have attended a Conformation & Movement “Hands on” Assessment conducted by a K.C. Accredited Trainer and passed the assessment. (K.C. policy as of 01/07/05.) To come into practice 01/01/2012 for all new applicants 01/01/2013 for existing applicants.**
- **To have attended a Seminar given by a K.C. Accredited Trainer on Conformation & Movement. (K.C. policy 01/07/01.)To be implemented on the B list from 2012 for all new applicants 01/01/ 2013 for existing applicants.**
- **To have attended a Seminar given by a K.C. Accredited Trainer, and passed the relevant examination on K.C. Rules & Judging Procedures. (K.C. policy 01/07/01.)To be implemented on the B list from 01/01/2012 for new applicants 01/01/ 2013 for existing applicants.**

Non Specialist Judges:

To have the support of the Club and have:

- A minimum of five years experience of judging any other Breed
- Judged at least thirty Border Terriers in breed classes
- Attended at least one Seminar on the Border Terrier Breed Standard
- Been placed and currently remain on the A or B List of a Breed Club for at least one other Breed
- Submitted an application / questionnaire if requested to do so
- Undertaken to write show critiques as customarily requested by the weekly dog press.

C List.

Indicates persons whom the Club would support to Judge the Breed at Open or Limited Shows where 3 or less classes are schedule

Breed Specialist Judges:

- To have the support of the Club and have:
- Been active in Border Terriers for at least three years
- Submitted an application / questionnaire if requested to do so.
- Undertaken to write show critiques as customarily requested by the weekly dog press.

Non Specialist Judges:-

To have the support of the Club and have:

- A minimum of three years experience of judging any other breed
- Been placed and currently remain on the A, B, or C List of a Breed Club for at least one other Breed
- Judged at least twelve Border Terriers in Breed classes
- Submitted an application / questionnaire if requested to do so
- Undertaken to write show critiques as customarily requested by the weekly dog press
